Legal operations in 2024

Above the Law and iManage survey highlights



In [2023](#), iManage began undertaking a yearly survey of legal operations professionals so we can better understand their challenges. Our customers' needs drive our strategy — and in a time of rapid change in the legal technology industry, a user-driven approach is more important than ever.

For 2024, we commissioned Above the Law to conduct a survey of their legal ops readers. Although a year has passed, this year's survey results reveal that many legal ops teams are facing the same challenges as last year, including process improvements, budget constraints, and—of course—choosing the right technology, especially AI.



What does your organization see as the most appealing **use cases** for generative AI?

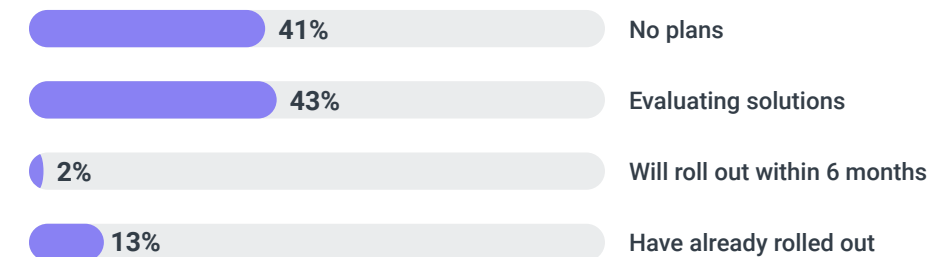

Generating interest: AI

To no one's surprise, generative AI is at the top of everyone's mind this year. AI will have a transformative effect on how legal professionals do their work, as evidenced by the fact that the majority of survey respondents are actively evaluating generative AI solutions (43%) or are already rolling one out (13%). This survey also provided unique insight into the specific legal processes where customers will look to apply generative AI (see sidebar).

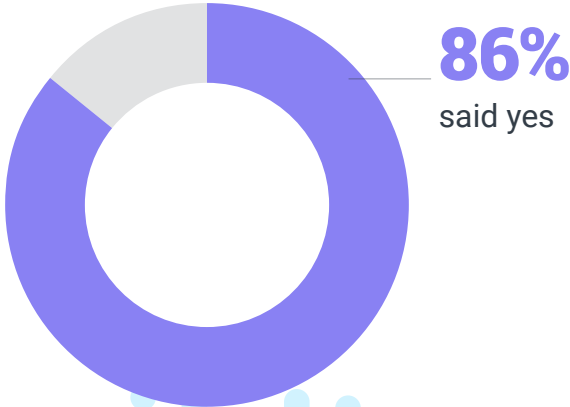
Does your organization have plans to roll out generative AI tools or solutions to your legal team?



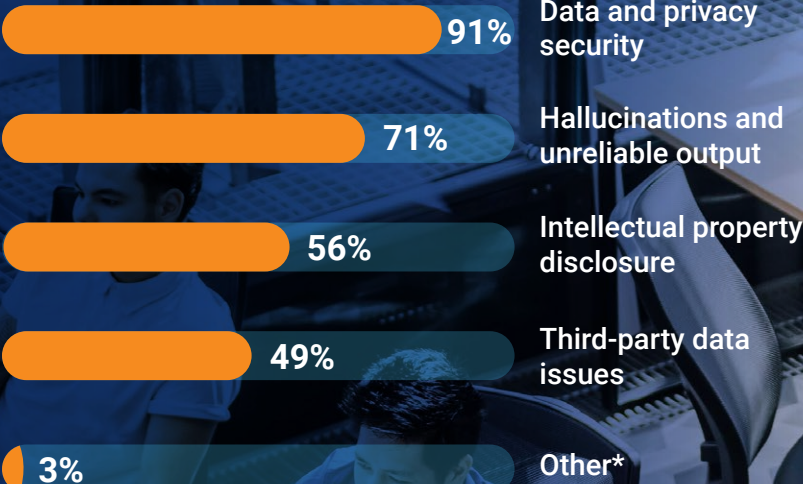
Implementing AI safely

Although interest in generative AI is high, security still remains top of mind for the legal ops professionals in our survey. Nearly all the respondents (86%) noted that they were concerned with the potential security risks of generative AI. Specifically, respondents ranked data security (91%), hallucinations (71%), and intellectual property disclosure (56%) as their top AI concerns.

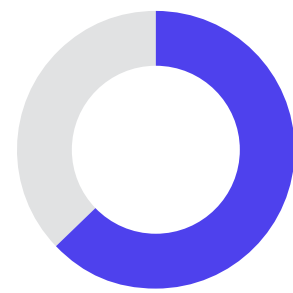

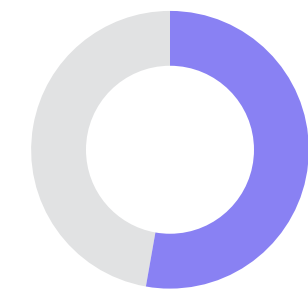
Focus on improvement

In both our 2024 and 2023 surveys, respondents ranked “increase time spent on legal activities over administration tasks” as their top KPI. Likely due to this focus, in both years they chose “business process improvements” as their top challenge.

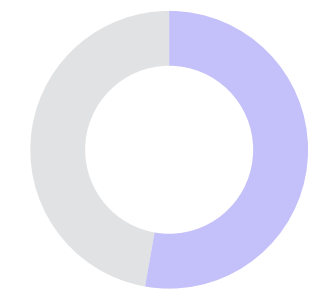
What are the top 3 challenges you face in your role?

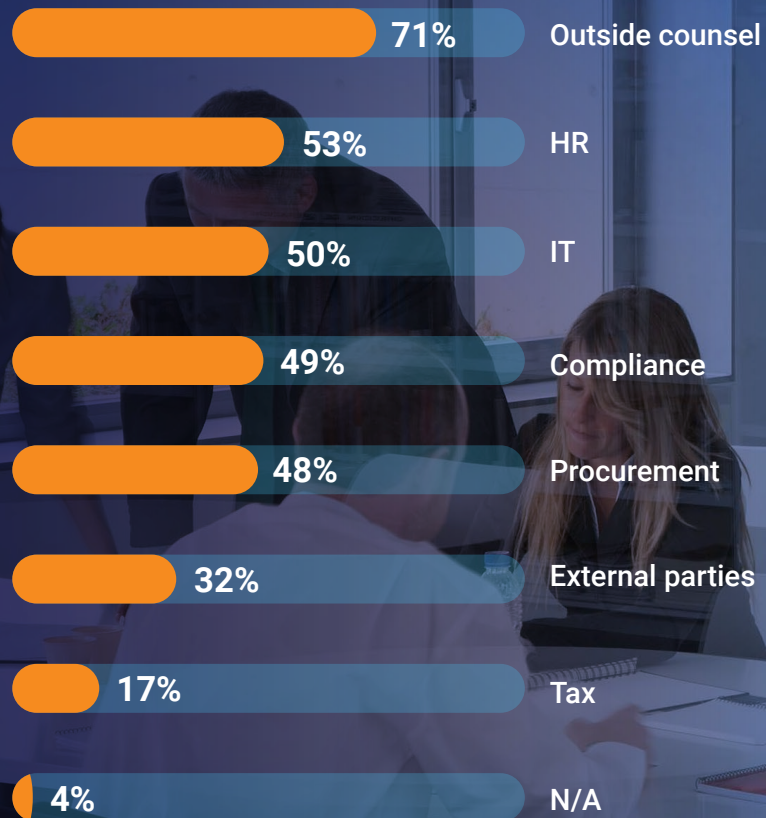


Do you feel you have the **right technology** in place to help with your business challenges?





The **top teams** legal departments collaborate and coordinate with are:

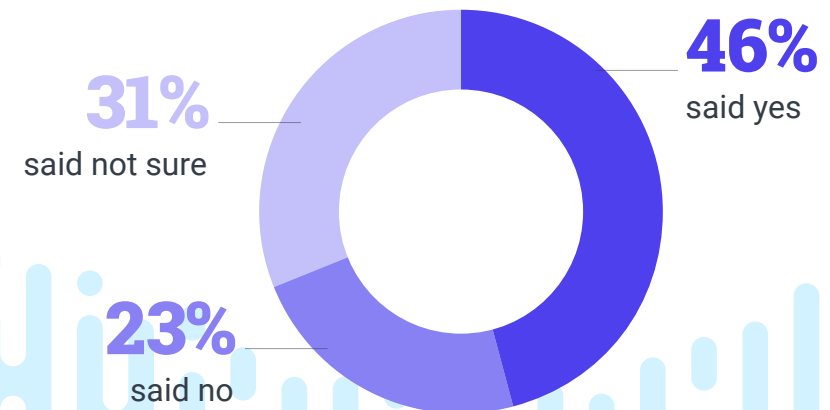


Collaboration inside and outside

Legal departments continue to demonstrate that they are a hub for their organization. Although survey respondents rank outside counsel as their top collaborators, legal teams are also working closely with other departments in their organization such as HR, IT, and compliance. In spite of this, only 46% of respondents said they had the right technology in place to support all this collaboration.

In this highly collaborative environment, it's critical that legal teams have the right tools to work with both internal and external stakeholders securely and without friction.

Communication in real time

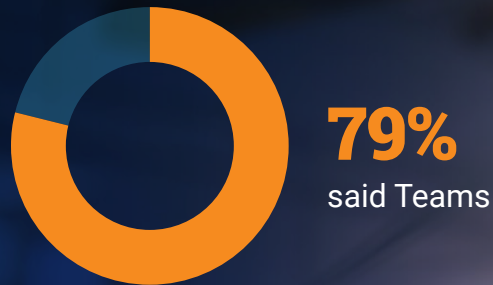
Hybrid work has made real-time messaging an essential tool for legal teams collaborating between home and office locations. Many legal teams also use real-time messaging to work with other departments in their organization or with outside counsel.

The majority of survey respondents said they relied on Microsoft Teams as their real-time messaging tool of choice. However, a strong majority also said that their organization did not have formalized rules in place governing these instant messages, something that integrating Teams with a secure document management system could help to address.

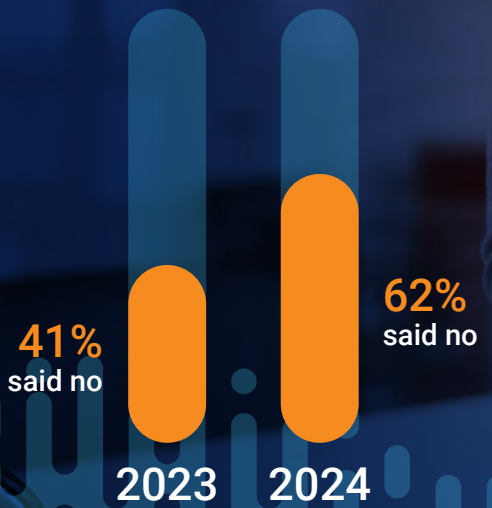
